Location: Currituck County, North Carolina
High school certainly isn't what it used to be -- at least not in Currituck County! Students here have access to some incredible opportunities for non-traditional learning. This September saw the opening of the J. P. Knapp Early College High School, whose students will graduate with a high school diploma AND two years of transferable college credit. UNC Greensboro's iSchool Virtual Early College offers a wide range of general education courses, allowing students to get a no-cost jump start on college while remaining at their traditional high school. Some students take advantage of dual enrollment at the College of the Albemarle, taking courses at the Elizabeth City campus or online.

Currituck County participates in the North Carolina Virtual Public School. This innovative program offers online courses that meet North Carolina's curriculum standards, are taught by certified teachers, and transfer to the student's local school with the same status as courses taken in a classroom. Students use this opportunity to take courses not available locally or whose sections at their local school are full, to graduate ahead of schedule, to take a more-than-full-time course load, to recover credit or do remedial work, or to keep up with high school credits when illness or other circumstances make regular attendance impossible.
